### What are Plastic Tubs and Lids:

Tubs and Lids are wide-mouth plastic containers numbered   and 

Examples:

- ~ Ice Cream
- ~ Cottage Cheese
- ~ Margarine
- ~ Sour Cream
- ~ Yogurt
- ~ Spreads and Dips

Tubs must be empty, clean and the lid removed.

Both lid and container can be placed in the blue box.

Plastic tubs, pails and lids must be less than 5 litres in size and made from plastic only (no metal handles).

Plastic handles are OK.

Please make sure that containers and lids are clean of all debris.

#### NOT ACCEPTED:

- ~ plastic toys
- ~ planting tray
- ~ plastic muffin trays
- ~ microwave meal trays
- ~ plastic bags
- ~ clamshell containers
- ~ plant pots
- ~ plastic egg cartons
- ~ screw top lids

NO petroleum or pesticide containers

## Preparing HHW FOR SAFE & EASY TRANSPORT

All materials should be left in the original container to allow easy identification of the contents.

**Do not mix products together.**

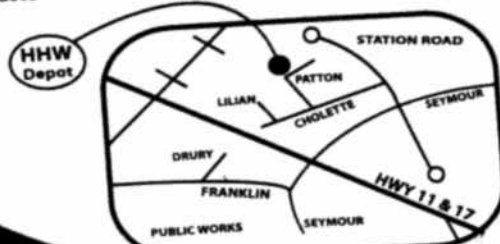
- Wastes should be sealed and labeled.
- Bring all hazardous waste in a cardboard box or rigid container.
- Collect household batteries in a small bag, plastic container, or coffee can.
- Load the vehicle just before leaving to minimize the buildup of fumes.

**OUR REUSE PROGRAM** - We carefully screen materials received and offer some products such as paint, stains, and varnishes back to the public free of charge if it is still usable. Why dispose of something that is still good? (Offered spring, summer and fall.)

## SAFE USE OF HAZARDOUS PRODUCTS

If you must use hazardous products, keep the following tips in mind in order to minimize your exposure to chemicals and potential danger to the environment:

- Buy only what you need.
- Give away what you do not use.
- Share seldom used products.
- Buy alternative products that are less hazardous.
- Never mix products together.
- Use only recommended amounts (more is not better).
- Choose products with child-resistant caps.
- Safely store all hazardous materials out of reach of children and pets.
- Use products in a well ventilated area.
- Never pour HHW in the storm sewer - it leads to Lake Nipissing.
- Do not bury hazardous waste, or pour it into the ground - it can contaminate groundwater.
